

Commissioner Code of Conduct

Public Comment



- Per Resolution ALJ-252, any member of the public (excluding parties and their representatives) who wishes to address the CPUC about matters before the Commission must sign up with the Public Advisor's Office table before the meeting begins. If an individual has signed up using the electronic system on the Commission's website, they must check in with the Public Advisor's Office on the day of the meeting, by the sign-up deadline.
- Once called, each speaker has up to 3 minutes at the discretion of the Commission President. Depending on the number of speakers, the time limit may be reduced to 1 minute.

Order Instituting Investigation on the Commission's Own Motion to Determine Whether Southern California Gas Company's and its Parent Company, Sempra's, Organizational Culture and Governance Prioritize Safety.

PROPOSED OUTCOME:

- Commencement of an investigation into whether Southern California Gas Company's (SoCalGas) and its parent company Sempra's organization culture and governance prioritize safety.
- In the initial phase of this proceeding, the Safety and Enforcement Division (SED), will be serving as the primary advisory staff and will investigate whether SoCalGas and its parent company's organizational culture and governance prioritize safety in conjunction with a consultant who will prepare a report on this topic.
- Proceeding is preliminarily categorized as quasi-legislative.

SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS:

• The purpose of this investigation is to investigate whether SoCalGas and its parent company's organizational culture and governance prioritize safety. SED is directed to investigate and produce a consultant's report. In later phases of this proceeding, the Commission may consider taking action to promote or compel a high-functioning safety culture at SoCalGas and its parent company, Sempra.

ESTIMATED COST:

• SoCalGas and its parent company, Sempra shall reimburse the Commission for a consultant contracted by SED in an amount not to exceed \$2 million, unless otherwise ordered by the assigned Commissioner.


